Site Specific Advisory Board Elects Officers for FY 2009

Steve Dixon, Ted Lundy, and John Coffman were elected chair, vice chair, and secretary of the Oak Ridge Site Specific Advisory Board during the board's annual planning retreat and meeting August 9. The SSAB is a federally chartered citizens' panel that provides recommendations to the DOE Oak Ridge Environmental Management Program.

Steve Dixon has served on the board since 2004. He is the owner of Spectra Environmental Group, which provides environmental services to over a thousand small businesses in the region. He is a Louisville resident and an 18-year member of the Blount County Chamber of Commerce.

Ted Lundy has been a member since 2006. He retired in 2000 from his position as the director of Tennessee Tech's Center for Manufacturing Research. He previously spent many years working at Oak Ridge National Laboratory in the Metallurgy Division, later known as the Metals and Ceramics Division. Lundy lives in Knoxville.

John Coffman is beginning his second year on the board. He is the president of DeNuke Services in Oak Ridge, which provides technical support services to contractors and subcontractors on DOE sites. John lives in Clinton and is a member of the Oak Ridge Chamber of Commerce, ETEBA, the American Nuclear Society, and the Health Physics Society.

The new officers assumed their duties at the conclusion of the retreat and will serve during the board's 2009 fiscal year, which runs from September through August.
