


Crossword Puzzle

1. Industrial land use that requires the soil must be clean to a depth of 10 feet and groundwater may not be used.
2. Agreement that was signed in 1992 for the Oak Ridge Reservation by DOE, EPA and TDEC.
3. The steward that has legal responsibility for the contaminated land and facilities.
7. Acronym for Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation.
8. Type of elements such as tritium, cesium, strontium, and uranium that are contaminants on the Oak Ridge Reservation.
9. Acronym for the prioritized list of the nation's worst hazardous waste sites.
10. Controls that are barriers that limit public access to hazardous contaminants.
12. A fund that receives money from taxes or a fee source and is more stable than the annual Congressional appropriations process.
13. Acronym for the Oak Ridge Site Specific Advisory Board, a volunteer citizens' panel that provides advice and recommendations to the DOE on its Oak Ridge Reservation environmental management program.
15. The acceptance of the responsibility and the implementation of activities necessary to maintain long-term protection of human health and of the environment from the hazards posed by residual radioactive and chemically hazardous materials.
16. The Government agency that currently retains financial responsibility to fund the stewardship program for the Oak Ridge Reservation.
