

Employee Concerns Program Survey

The Office of Civil Rights has developed a survey to assess the effectiveness of the various DOE and Contractor Employee Concerns Programs. This survey is a more detailed follow-up to an initial survey conducted by the National Academy of Public Administration in 2000 on the Department of Energy's Employee Concerns Program.

On April 11, 2006 Secretary Bodman issued a memorandum for all Departmental elements entitled, '*Employee Concerns Program Statement.*' In his memorandum, the Secretary stated that all Federal and contractor personnel "have the right – and the responsibility – to identify and report concerns associated with safety, quality, environment, health, security or management of DOE operations without fear of reprisal."

The objective of this survey is to collect information regarding the climate for the expression of concerns to the Employee Concerns Program by Federal and contractor employees. Specifically, the survey will reflect if employees are aware of program services, are encouraged to raise concerns, and are satisfied with how concerns are resolved.
