

29th Department of Energy Management Awards Ceremony

The Department of Energy (DOE) honored DOE personnel at a noon luncheon awards ceremony on October 6, 2010 at the Omni Shoreham Hotel in Washington, DC, for outstanding contributions to energy, water, and vehicle fleet management at DOE facilities and field organizations. This was the 29th Department of Energy Management Awards ceremony, established by the former In-House Energy Management Program, and now presented by the Federal Energy Management Program under the Assistant Secretary for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy.

Awards were presented to 5 organizations, 1 small group, 2 individuals and 2 energy champions from Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Argonne National Laboratory, Princeton Plasma Physics Laboratory, National Renewable Energy Laboratory, Bonneville Power Administration, and the Office of Legacy Management. Their hard work and innovation resulted in estimated energy and cost savings of approximately 154 billion British Thermal Units of energy and \$300 million in FY 2009. The projects also reduced water usage by about 2.1 billion gallons for an additional cost savings of \$2.5 million.
