## ePegasus

I would like to remind everyone that ePegasus is the system all ORO organizations should use to plan and report assessments such as walkthroughs, surveillances, federal self-assessments and oversight activities for contractor operations. This includes tracking any issues or actions resulting from those assessments. ePegasus is also used to track assessments on the Integrated Assessment Schedule. Please remember that the system provides readily accessible methods to document, track and trend oversight activities, as required by DOE directives and SCMS. If you or your organization can benefit from additional ePegasus training, please let your supervisor know.
